Important Points to Remember

- Cash is King
 - Importance of building and maintaining reserves
 - Once borrowed, need to replenish doubles
- Deferral Cost More
 - Postponement of tax and rate increases generally results in larger, less palatable increases
 - Need for capital improvements is not decreasing
- Financial Issues
 - Operating Cost increase annually
 - · Ability to manage to some degree
 - Some items outside our control
 - Debt Service is concern

Addressing the Deficit • Eliminate 2% Spending Cap - Erodes ability to set aside funds for "Rainy Day" - Since inception – 1% in 2013 • Utilize Cash Balances - Maybe a one-time fix - Difficulty in replacing cash used - Impact on FY 2022 Budget • Remove all New Positions • Hiring Freeze as of 4/1 workforce • Remove all additional Step increases - Except for Wastewater Operator I (License) • Other Ideas



Tax Rate Increase History


- Consider Annual Increase
 - Avoid Negative Press Impacts
 - Minimized Magnitude of Increase
- Easier for Residents to Adjust
 - Smaller incremental increases
- Eliminates "Catch Up" after two to three years of higher costs
- Every one cent increase, generates \$5,087 income




