


Municipal Street Aid


- Monetary inflation result of national money supply considerations

Transportation Funding

- Municipal Street Aid
 - Appreciate the Governor's Recommend Budget including Municipal Street Aid at \$6,000,000
 - Request that this be increased to \$10,000,000
 - This is critical funding to all municipalities used to improve our roadway infrastructure
- Community Transportation Funds at \$22,680,000 (\$630,000 for drainage)
 - This represents a decrease from last year's funding level of \$52,150,000

Clean Water

- Important resource locally and globally
- Many people take fresh drinking water for granted but this is a finite resource
- One way to help conserve fresh water is by utilizing beneficial reuse water
- Many of the municipal systems in Sussex County utilize various filtration methods which produce water which is almost drinkable
- Developers and institutions benefit from utilizing reclaimed water for irrigation
 - Lower cost irrigation
 - Added nutrients
 - Less need for land for RIBS (Rapid Infiltration Basins)

Municipal Elections and State Voter Registration List

- SB 233 passed Senate; now in House
- HB 146 Introduced in House last year
- Require municipalities to use State Voter Registration list for all municipal elections
- Implementation for municipal elections on or after January 1, 2024

Municipalities Voluntarily using State Voter Registration System

- 12 as of January 2021
- 5 additional since January 2021 (42% growth in one year)
- More municipalities considering voluntary use
- All of them have populations of 1600 or more

Issues

- Based on assumptions that all municipalities:
 - Have uniform voter eligibility requirements
 - Require all voters to register for municipal elections
- Assumes that municipal voter registration laws create widespread confusion for residents

Issues (continued)

- Bills will create "overwhelming" burden on municipalities, especially smaller ones
- List provided by Department of Elections containers ALL registered voters in the municipality's zip code
- Municipality must sift through and identify residents
- If non-residents permitted to vote, residents must be separated from non-residents and separate list created

Thoughts

- Municipalities should remove unnecessary obstacles to voting
- Voter Registration Systems should be designed to meet needs of individual municipalities
- Municipalities should not be forced to adopt a system that does not make voting easier for its citizens and creates unnecessary work
- Use of State's Voter Registration List should continue to be voluntary

§10004. Open Meetings

- A meeting that is open to the public under paragraph (a)(1) of this section must include time for public comment
 - The time for public comment must provide a meaningful opportunity for the public to engage with the public body
 - A public body may impose reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions on the length of the public comment period, and the amount of time allotted for each public comment

§10004. Open Meetings

• Specifically exempts any meeting of a public body within the General Assembly which is governed by the rules of proceedings adopted under § 9 of Art. II of the Delaware Constitution

Coastal Issues – Funding Opportunities

- Governor Carney's budget includes \$10 million to match federal funds
- The Federal Water Resources Development Act includes \$10.5 million for dredging of the Lewes-Rehoboth Canal
- Army Corps of Engineers have been asked to recognize the economic impact of recreational use of coastline
- Opportunities to work together to leverage federal funds

Coastal Issues – Funding Opportunities continued

- Need to work together to prepare for and mitigate climate change
- Proactive solutions are needed and will require State, County, and Municipal officials to work together to protect this vital part of our State's economy
