Rental License Notice

Residential rental properties within Wards 2 and 4 are required to have their biennial inspections performed for the 2026 license year. Inspections must be scheduled and/or completed no later than **January 31, 2026**.

The property owner or a representative must be present for the inspection; all inspection and renewal fees will be payable to the Town of Georgetown once invoiced. Please contact First State Inspection Agency at (302) 422-3859 or inspections@firststateinspection.com to schedule a date for the inspection. Rental/Business License Renewal Forms will be mailed once the property passes all inspections.

To renew a license, applicants must be current on all Town obligations per the Clean Hands Ordinance, Town Code §89-2.

The completed renewal form, fee, and other required documents are due by March 1, 2026.

Reminders from Code Enforcement...

- * Holiday Seasonal Lighting is to be removed within 30 days after the holiday with which the holiday seasonal lighting is associated (§ 116-146 Holiday Seasonal Lighting).
- * Please remove snow or ice from the sidewalks within 24 hours following the ceasing of the precipitation (§ 190.1 Unremoved snow or ice a nuisance).









Monthly Commentary

In November, Delaware's year-over-year job growth continues to be driven by the *Private Education and Health Services* industry, which added 2,500 jobs (not-seasonally adjusted), accounting for 75 percent of the state's total nonfarm job increase of 3,300. Sussex County led statewide growth, adding 2,000 jobs, primarily in *Private Education and Health Services, Professional and Business Services, and Leisure and Hospitality*. New Castle County added 1,300 jobs, led by gains in *Private Education and Health Services, Professional and Business Services, and Trade, Transportation, and Utilities*. Employment in Kent County remained largely flat, as gains in *Private Education and Health Services* were offset by losses in *Leisure and Hospitality, Federal Government, and Manufacturing*.

Delaware Labor Force Trends

Delaware's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in November 2025 was 4.9%, up from 4.5% in September 2025. There were 25,400 unemployed Delawareans in November 2025 compared to 18,200 in November 2024. The US unemployment rate was 4.6% in November 2025, up from 4.4% in September 2025. In November 2024, the US unemployment rate was 4.2%, while Delaware's rate was 3.6%.

In November 2025, seasonally adjusted nonfarm employment was 494,000, up from 493,300 in October 2025. Since November 2024, Delaware's total nonfarm jobs have increased by a net gain of 3,300, a rise of 0.7%. Nationally, jobs during that period increased by 0.5%.




