7. ABANDONMENT OF PAPER STREETS – DECISION

Motion by Councilman Barrett, seconded by Councilwoman Diaz-Malone to approve the abandonment of paper streets on Teaberry Lane connection to 135-20.00-2.02, Frankenberry Drive connection to 135-19.00-63.02, and Cinder Way connection to 135-20.00-6.00 subject to the petitioner granting a 30' utility easement for water and sewer infrastructure.

8. PROJECT UPDATE - SPRINGBOARD COLLABORATIVE, PALLET SHELTERS

Judson Malone and Trish Hill provided an update on the pallet shelter project and engagement with the community. Key points discussed are as follows:

- Emphasis on improving health of participants, not just providing shelter
- Assistance to become self sufficient
- Mobile treatment center once a week
- Hiring a housing navigator
- Developing focus groups
- Progress on prepping the site is moving along rapidly
- Questions/comments posed from Council

9. GREAT FUND REQUEST - GEORGETOWN HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Town manager Dvornick read 37 pieces of correspondence received into the record. The majority of the correspondence was against providing funding to Georgetown Historical Society due to the confederate flag and monument.

Questions/Comments from Public:

- Multiple members from the audience (online and in person) spoke against providing funds to the Georgetown Historical Society.
- Several members from the audience spoke in favor of providing funds to the Georgetown Historical Society subject to finding a better suited place for the confederate flag and monument.

Jim Bowden, President of the Georgetown Historical Society, provided some background on the monument and flag located on their property and answered some questions posed from the audience. Bowden also advised that Georgetown Historical Society did not maintain the monument because of an agreement it entered into with another group which placed the monument.

Motion by Councilwoman Diaz-Malone, seconded by Mayor West to table the GREAT Fund Request from the Georgetown Historical Society. **Motion Failed (2 yea's, 3 nay)**
